One year ago this month, I was thinking about the challenges of the previous fourteen months since schools initially closed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Everyone was "broken down and tired," but excited to put the pandemic behind us, enjoy a rejuvenating summer, and get back to "normal." During that time, I heard <u>Rise Up</u>, by Andra Day, and was touched by the lyrics. Watching the official music video elevated the meaning of "Rise Up" to an entirely new level for me and I felt compelled to share it with each of you.

I knew that the message was somewhat of a departure from our previous themes. This message from Andra Day was more inspirational than motivational; more personal than organizational; more "Raw" than "Rah, Rah!" I experienced this firsthand as I watched the video shown in opening faculty meetings. Powerful emotions, from deeply personal stories, surfaced and connected with phrases from the song:

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While we all acknowledge these difficult facts; our commitments, views, and actions during the past year have hopefully been shaped by these <u>Rise Up</u> lyrics:

I'll rise up, in spite of the ache. All we need is hope and for that we have each other. And I'll rise up I'll rise like the day I'll rise up I'll rise up I'll rise up And I'll do it a thousand times again. For you.

We need hope, we have hope. And the reason we have hope, strength, endurance, optimism, and courage – **we have each other!** Each of you make it so that others are "able to see that there is light despite all of the darkness" (Desmond Tutu).

Profound "Thanks" to each of you for rising up yet again this year. Please enjoy the final few days of this school year with your students and your Nebo friends – those cherished souls who give us each the hope we need to "Rise Up!"
